Dear Community Members of Independence and Liberty Townships,
 At this time each school year, our district has begun the task of budget development which involves the time and diligence of our Business Administrator. I would like to welcome, Mr. Tim Havlusch, our new Business administrator to our school district. Mr. Havlusch comes to GMRSD with an extensive background in business and many years of experience serving as a Business Administrator in Bergen and Hudson counties. Working in conjunction with the business office, the district continues to collaborate with our newly formed Operations Committee to ensure a quality fiscal responsibility to our community members.

In our previous newsletters, we touched upon our ROD Grant projects. During the month of February, with the assistance of district personnel and Independence Chief of Police, Chief Riley, we will begin our process for the placement and installation of surveillance cameras. My district office will keep you abreast throughout as this process unfolds.

At our January 28th public meeting, representatives from Honeywell Inc and Energy Savings Improvement Program (ESIP), presented an Energy Conservation plan. Phases of the ESIP project are set to begin this upcoming spring. We have been working on ensuring Elizabethtown Gas for the expansion of gas lines/availability as not only a part of our ESIP project that will benefit Central School and Great Meadows Middle School but will also benefit the residents of Independence Township. Our office has been meeting with Mayor Giordano and council members to discuss possible residential and community opportunities as a result of access to the gas lines.

I would like to thank Mr. Ron Marinelli, our district's Facilities Supervisor, for his efforts in ensuring Elizabethtown Gas as the provider, and I would also like to thank Mayor Giordano for his time and efforts in this matter.

In closing, the district would like to thank members of both the Independence and Liberty communities for their continued support in all district initiatives.

PARCC Preparation

Our students are working hard to prepare for the PARCC Performance Based Assessment (PBA) in March as well as the End of Year (EOY) assessment in May. It is important to understand that with the Journeys and Everyday Math programs we do not need to "teach to the test" because we are already covering the depth of the Common Core State Standards in our normal instructional practice. That being said, since the students are testing online for the first time, we feel the need to prepare them specifically for that portion of the test. Mr. D'Agostino is taking each class through a tutorial of the features that they will access during the test so that they will be familiar with navigating the testing site. Each classroom teacher is dedicating a portion of their lesson time each week to take the practice tests that are available so that the students are familiar with the question types and answer formats. Annual Reviews are set up each year to look at specific course programming and related services provided for each student (Individualized Educational Program). This is an opportunity to discuss strengths as well as areas that may need more work. It is important that parents and guardians attend these meetings in order to provide relevant information into your child's IEP.

In January we shared with the Board of Education our idea to create an LLD (Learning and Language Disabled) classroom in Central School to add yet another layer of support to our youngest students. The addition of this classroom will help to create a continuum of services in all three buildings throughout our district.
